## SHERROD BROWN AND ELIZABETH WARREN: DANGEROUSLY LIBERAL ON NATIONAL SECURITY

*Frost: Warren's Liberal Policies Endanger our National Security  
Brown Votes with her 95% of the Time*

**Cleveland, OH** - As career politician Sherrod Brown prepares to welcome liberal Massachusetts Senator Elizabeth Warren to Cleveland for a fundraiser to benefit his 2018 re-election campaign, the Republican Party of Cuyahoga County voiced concern over their dangerously liberal national security policy positions. Both Senators support sanctuary cities, reductions in the U.S. military budget and the Obama Iran deal. Brown also opposes common sense policies like increased screening of Syrian and Iraqis, and designating North Korea as a state sponsor of terrorism.

*"It's no surprise that liberal Massachusetts Senator Elizabeth Warren's liberal policies endanger our national security," said Republican Party of Cuyahoga County Chairman Rob Frost. "But what might be surprising to Ohioans is that Sherrod Brown is in perfect lockstep with Warren's dangerously liberal policies. In fact, Sherrod Brown votes with Elizabeth Warren 95% of the time.*

*"From supporting sanctuary cities and defense cuts to opposing increased screening of Syrian and Iraqi refugees, Elizabeth Warren and Sherrod Brown are working every day to make America and Ohioans less safe. Sherrod Brown even voted against designating North Korea as a state sponsor of terrorism. The Warren-Brown Liberal Agenda is dangerous and Ohio deserves better. We deserve a senator that we can trust on national security issues and believes in a strong national defense. Next November, Ohio voters will reject the Warren-Brown Liberal Agenda, because our safety and security depend on it."*
